### Sarah Ireland, Director of Commissioning and Improvement, Croydon Council (GB)

Sarah Ireland has worked for Croydon Council for 25 years in a variety of roles including commissioning, procurement, strategy, policy, performance community and third sector development. # Tim Rudin, Supplier Skills and Responsible Procurement Manager, Commercial Strategy and Performance, Transport for London (GB)

Tim has been working in the field of responsible procurement at Transport for London (TfL) and the Greater London Authority (GLA) for over ten years. He is currently TfL's Responsible Procurement and Supplier Skills Manager, leading on implementing social, economic and environmental aspects of responsible procurement requirements within TfL's approximately £6bn annual spend. Tim also heads TfL's Supplier Skills Team, which implements skills and employment requirements in tenders, and works with suppliers to deliver outcomes across London. To date the team has supported TfL's supply chain in creating over 5,000 apprenticeships, and was recently the recipient of the Lord Mayor of London's Dragon Award for Enterprise and Employment.

## Amman Batth, Director, AMBA Consultancy Ltd. (GB)

Amman is a procurement and project management professional with nearly 20 years' experience in private and public sectors in the United Kingdom. Amman started her career in operational and logistical I.T. procurement and worked with Hewlett Packard, Siemens, Computer Sciences Corporation and Scottish and Southern Energy when she worked in the private sector. She joined the public sector in London in 2007 after achieving her MCIPS and then worked with Transport for London, the NHS, a number of Universities and then local government departments (Richmond, Kensington, Hammersmith, Westminster, Barnet and Croydon Councils), finally specialising in commissioning and procurement in Family Services, voluntary and charity services and general business. Amman incorporated her own business in 2013 and has worked independently since then. She is now leading a procurement project with the States of Guernsey in the Channel Islands.
