
### Public procurement matters: vital for effective public service delivery

### Public procurement - a large share of the economy:

- 12% of GDP in OECD countries, 6.4 trillion €
- 30% of general government expenditures
- 63% spent at the subnational level

Public procurement impacts many areas of public service delivery:










### Public procurement is a key enabler for a governments' strategic policy agenda



### Leveraging on this economic and political dimensions required a new strategic approach

In 2015, the OECD Council adopted the **Recommendation on Public Procurement** which is built upon 12 integrated principles:





### An OECD view on strategic public procurement

"Broader policy objectives should be balanced against the primary procurement objective."

OECD Recommendation, principle V

#### Guiding principles to achieve this balance:

- 1. Evaluate whether public procurement is the best option to pursue this particular goal (e.g. sustainability)!
- 2. Develop a strategy!
- 3. Assess the impact measure the results!



### Talking about social: part of a broader concept of Sustainability in Public Procurement

• <u>Sustainable Public Procurement</u>: a strategic approach that promotes the integration of the three pillars of sustainable development, i.e. **economic development**, **social development** and **environmental protection**, in the procurement function.

• It is fully aligned with the UN 2015 SDGs (Sustainable Development Goals)!


### The Progress Report highlights that

- public procurement is at the heart of achieving the strategic policy agenda of governments
- promoting sustainable public procurement is an integral part of the Sustainable Development Goals
- public procurement regulatory frameworks are themselves being implemented in more strategic ways
- new public procurement methods are being tested
- there is increasing use of digital technologies throughout the public procurement life cycle



### State of play: Public procurement is increasingly used to pursue broader policy objectives








### The challenges of implementing strategic public procurement

- risk aversion
- setting up new forms of co-ordination and collaboration
- lack of skills and capacity
- fear/reluctance(?) on the side of the procurement officials to dialogue with suppliers
- lack of data and appropriate methodologies (sometimes lack of financial resources) to measure the impact of the strategic use of procurement
- insufficient incentives









### Follow-up and monitoring: measuring results against strategic goals (Innovation, RBC)

...Responsible business conduct (RBC)







### Increasing complexity & expectations require workforce with adequate capabilities & skills

Measures in place to ensure adequate capacity of procurement workforce:

- Entry requirements designed according to each the needs of each CA
  - Entry requirements linked to a competency model
  - Obligatory public procurement training for public procurement officials
    - Others (nonobligatory training, standard public service entry requirements...)
  - Certification process for public procurement officials




- Many procurement professionals work in strategic roles that demand high-level strategic, tactical as well as operational skills.
- There are not many entry requirements into PP. Some of the existing ones are linked to a competency model or certification frameworks.
- Countries are investing to bridge this gap in many cases with collaborative initiatives

- Most comprehensive international standard on responsible business conduct
- Recommendations from governments to businesses
- Incorporate expectation of supply chain due diligence
- 2018: global common understanding on due diligence relevant for business but also government (economic actor)






### Why RBC in public procurement? The moral argument

The moral argument: combatting modern slavery and child labour, respecting human rights and preventing long-term damage in supply chains.


Sectors of forced labour exploitation

### Why RBC in public procurement? The policy coherence argument

#### The **policy coherence** argument:

- Governments to lead by example, creating an enabling environment for RBC
- Regulatory requirements for companies to incorporate rights due diligence in global supply chain management
  - Modern Slavery Acts in the UK & Australia
  - Devoir de Vigilance Act in France
  - Transparency in Supply Chains Act in California



### How to include RBC in public procurement?





#### **Evolution of RBC in public procurement**

- Many governments have already adopted procurement rules and guidelines that include RBC considerations
- Green procurement, social procurement, sustainable procurement, contribution to SDGs, etc.
- Often approach is fragmented, or only covers direct suppliers
- →Growing concern regarding **social considerations** in supply chains in different sectors, products and services including: labour rights violations and human rights.



### Way forward: strengthening policy coherence

#### **OECD Programme:**

#### Leveraging public procurement for RBC

- Policy: take stock on what OECD countries are doing on RBC and procurement
- Practitioners: Need for sharing learnings and good practice, exchanging information on risks
- Tools: Increasing number of RBC tools and RBC related data are emerging
- Platform: OECD can convene policy-makers, practitioners, business and civil society and facilitate exchanges


